A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING SAFETY AND HE PREVENTION OF GUN VIOLENCE ON COLLEGE CAMPUSES

DATE HERE

WHEREAS, the Nevada Student Alliance acknowledges the profound impact of gun violence on college campuses and recognizes the tragic incident at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, on December 6, 2023, which claimed the lives of three esteemed faculty members: Dr. Patricia Navarro Velez, Dr. Jerry Chang, and Dr. Naoko Takemaru, wounded three other individuals of those being one professor and two first responders, and left multiple students, faculty and staff suffering from panic attacks; and

WHEREAS, the victims of the UNLV shooting on December 6, 2023, were three faculty members of the university, identified as Dr. Patricia Navarro-Velez, a distinguished assistant professor of accounting; Dr. Jerry Chang, a respected professor of management and information systems; and Dr. Naoko Takemaru a dedicated associate professor of Japanese studies, all of whom were esteemed educators contributing significantly to the academic community; and

WHEREAS, it is deeply regrettable to note that each of the identified professors was a member of minority communities, further underscoring the impact gun violence has on marginalized communities and


WHEREAS, every student has the right to pursue their education in a safe and secure environment, free from the threat of gun violence; and.

WHEREAS, commendation is warranted for the University Police - Southern Command Officers and first responders for their swift and urgent response time, arriving at the UNLV campus within seventwight seconds, undoubtedly preserving the safety of numerous students, faculty, and staff.



Choose one or more races that you consider yourself to be (N = 278)




What is your current gender identity? (N = 257)





Child-care Support (N = 29)


Are you currently a UNR student and a parent at the same time?


Would you be willing to work on a project that lasted both but would involve an Academic and Industry collaboration? (N = 229)
