Chancellor Rose visited the NSC campus to have open forum with students, staff, faculty to discuss the possibilities afpresidential search. Students and staff were able to tell Rose what they are looking for in their next campus leader. Says her next step in the search process is to speak with Broard Chair and Vice Chairthey will help her decide if she should move forward with a national ch, since she had an overwhelming amount of requests to do so.

As of today they have eived \$601,446 for a variety of different projects, including traffic safety initiatives, walk through metal detectors from as and Mack to additional police positions (which will be assigned to homeless and residential life), layers on prem machines and more. Officers of Southern Command have received over, 200 hours of training, an increase since 2019.

Adam G. discusses his opinion on the revide prolice reform within Nevada/NSHE campuses. He testified August before the Special dislative Session in support AB3. He has worked with the NLV Antiblack Racism Task Force and engaged with the Center for Democratic Culture and the Firest Directory Project.

He has cecreated a policy that will include a npus Review Board. Approved by the Board of Regents, the board will review disciplinary actions by University Police Administration, which will put them [campus police] compliance with the law.

Chair Clark states that because of the Northern Command's fundraiser, \$600 was donated to theood pantry at Western Neva@allege.

NSA Member Suman Randhawa of NSC will introduce Dr. Kimberly Florence. Dr. Florence is the Community Resource Coordinator with Nevada State College's Community Engagement and Diversity Initiatives (C.E.D.I). Dr. Florence will present on the proclamation for Indigenous Peoples Day as put forth by C.E.D.I.

Suman R. introduces Dr. Kimberly Florence.

Dr. Florence gives a review on the importance of Indigenous People's Day: She recently met Beverly Harry, @rdinator for the Indigenous @mmunity and she talkd

to herabout the issues that are significant for Native American adigenous people. One of Harry's goals is to seadigenous Poples Day be celebrated in Nevada.

Dr. Florence spoke with heritector in the Office of Community Engagement Diversity Initiatives on how NSHE can help Indigenous People's Day be recognized as a state holiday. She has state committee meetings with University of Nevada, Reno to discuss drafting of proclamation.

Dr. Florence gave a disclaimer thattet opinions expressed by Dr. Florence are solely her own.

Dr. Florence stateshtere is a lack of appreciation and understanding of Native American and digenous history, and culturee hause of that, there is ten skewed opinions about Native American digenous history as well as their contributes in Nevada She believes having a day that recognizes Indigenous People will give opportunity, (especially for) college campuses to begin discussions contributed in Native American and digenous history. It will also be an opportunity to encourage and invite Native American digenous youth to be a part of the higher education community and to feel accepted various campuses

Clark County will be acknowledging Indigenous People's Day, but not in lieu of Columbus Day.

Chair Clark gives some clarification on resolution Resolution must be writteny October 2th, so it can be discussed during the next NSAtMg[November 1th]. Once the resolution is written and discussed during the November metalsky, will present the resolution to our respective ampuses and discuss it with our campuses and office members. Then, NSA will bring it back to the table further discussion. In December the resolution will essentially ome to fruition and will be considered an action item.

Padilla asks for clarification on the two processes of resolutions proposed by NSA members.

Davis says she, with Caserto, will have to do morearesh to know that answer.


