On motion, Regent Fish and Mr. Brown were appointed a committéé

Furnold and Dr. George Bates. Whereupon by unanimous action of the Board Dr. J. E. Stubbs of Berea, Ohio was duly elected and the Secretary was instructed to notify him by mail of his

election.

On motion, the President of the Board of Regents was instructed
to wire Dr. Stubbs of his election and ask if he accept.
