I felt it was difficult to get an honest and com-
municated message from the members of the Board, receiving
from them the false information. On September
20th, Professor Jackson notified me that he was absent
because he had a leave of absence, and that he would
be going, he mentioned his resignation, make
effective as of the 1st of March, Monday.
On October 2nd, immediately upon my return, I had an in-
terview with Professor Jackson to discuss his
leave of absence and his resignation. I found that he
did not wish to resign his position; his business af-
fairs were chaotic and he was unable to
attend to his duties, and that he did not need
all the time he was taking. Before he resigned, Pro-
fessor Jackson agreed with me that he would not
meet with the Board. Pending a meeting of the
Board of Regents, I told him that I would not go to
his leave of absence, but that he would have to
be available, I would make a decision if he left his class
and his position for Mr. Jacob, but that I would hold
him responsible for the election in the Department. This
decision was a disappointment, and I had to discuss it
with the Board in an advisory capacity.
