Regent Deal offered the following preamble and resolution which was upon motion carried.

WHEREAS, it is absolutely necessary that the President of the State University should reside upon the grounds at the University belonging to the State, and

WHEREAS, by reason of the crowded condition of the buildings now erected there is no sufficient or suitable accommodation for the President or his family, and for the above and other causes it is fo

the State of Nevada until the State of Nevada may repay the same, a sum of not less than Seven Thousand dollars, to be expended for such purposes as the Board of Regents may direct, upon condition, that a portion of the grounds of the University suitable for said purposes and herein after described, shall be leased to said J. E. Stubbs at a nominal rental until the said sums so advanced, are repaid.

THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED by the Board of Regents in meeting regularly assembled, that the President and Secretary of the Board be, and they hereby are authorized in the name and on behalf of the State of Nevada, by and through the Board of Regents of the Nevada State University, to execute and deliver to J. E. Stubbs a lease at an annual rental of One dollar, for the period of ten years, with the right of successive renewals for the same period, upon the same terms, as
