5. *HANDBOOK* REVISION, MILLENNIUM SCHOLARSHIP SPRING 2020 CONTINUING ELIGIBILITY WAIVER

Vice Chancellor for Academic and Student Affairs Crystal Abba will present for approval a revision to Board policy *tile 4, Chapter 18, Section 9*) implementing the waiver of certain eligibility requirements for the Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarshipt **bo**rized with the enactment of <u>Senate Bill 2Chapter 2Statutes of Nevada 31st Special Session</u>). Specifically, the provisions will waive the continuing eligibility requirements for students that lost eligibility at the end of Spring 2020 *ef. BOR-5*)

FISCAL IMPACT: The proposed revision does not have direct fiscal impact (cost) to the NSHE or its institutions; however, it is estimated that cost to the Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship Trust Fund that is administered by the State Treasurer's Office will be up to \$2.6 million over the subsequent semesters in which the students who would have otherwise lost eligibility enroll and are funded.
